

"Another matter, the importance of which can not be overestimated is that a cooperative marketing organization which excreises effective control over the grading and packing of products can build up a valuable reputation for the producers of its locality. When buyers learn that the grade or use producers of its locality. When buyers learn that the grade and packing of any particular association may be relied upon absolutely, its goods are sought out and its name or trade-mark becomes an asset of value to each member of the association. Another advantage is that, handling a larger volume of business, the association may find it profitable to devote more attention, not only to securing general market information, but also to locking into the comparative advantages of dealing with different buyers in the same market than can be done by individual producers. Its larger volume of business also tends to increase competition among buyers for its products and enables it, in many instances, to ship in carload quantities.
