ture's 1982 session and

32 by a vote of 36 to o.
Sentate Bill 32 seeks to
amend the Kentucky Re
vised Statutes to require
each executive order of the
governor relating to his re
organization authority to be
presented to the legislature
as a separate bill.
The reasoning of Senate
Bill 32 is to prohibit the
governor from lumping all
his reorganization actions
into one bill, so the legis-
lature will tot have to con-
sider a bill that has both
good and bad provisions.
