Firewood insects annoying but not harmful to folks

be plentiful at times, but most cause no real threat her homes or to people otOne of the best signs that firewood contains insects is sawdust under the woodshould be on also for a large number of bugs present before wood burning season. Woodboring
beetles can be plentiful in beetles can be plentiful in
wood and can become a big nuisance to homeown ers. They are up to two
inches long with bright colored bodies of red, yellow
and black. The beetles and black. The beetles
found in firewood are not
the type of insect that will the type of insect that will
infest the lumber used to infest the lumber used to
construct a home. They are just an inconvenience to the homeowner. Another
brightly colored insect that can be a nuisance to homeowners is the wood wasp. are fnum infesting old elm
trees in Kentucky. For people who cut their own
wood, these wasps can seem like a real threat. inary wasps look like ordunable to sting humans. ing loads families start haulthey may notice a large number of wood roaches in the house. Most of the
roaches found in firewood are in the nymph stage, with flat, dark red or brown bodies just over half
an inch long. Pennsylvania an inch long. Pennsylvania
wood roaches are found mostly in dead, hollowedout firewood or under loose
bark. But even if they do bark. But even if they do
get into the house, they get into the house, they they are an outside roach. Termits are a major worry of home homeowners, but they generally do not cause
problems in the home when they are brought inside in firewood. It would take
an entire termite colony to an entire termite colony to
establish a nest in your home, and the possibility of transferring an entire colony in firewood is very
slim. Carpenter ants slim. Carpenter ants are can excavate large portions of firewood or tumber, homeowners need not wor-
ry. When firewood is cut ry. When firewood is cut,
the colonv is broken up
and the possibility of the
colony reestablishing itself colony reestahlishing itself
in the woodpue is very unlikely. Chances for any damage are slim. The best protection for homeewners is to store firewood away
fromr afe house to prevent the insects from coming into the house in the first place. It is suggested that
firewood be stacked away irewood be stacked away
from any buildings and not kept in the basement, and that wood be brought into
the house in small amounts the house in small amounts
to keep the possibility of io keep the possibility of
insects at a minimum. All
wood should be removed noects at a minimum. Ald should be removed
wrom the house at the end from the house at the end
of the winter. There is no of the winter. There is no
need to spray either fire wood or your home with insecticide as long as you store wood properly. If insects are carried into
your house in wood, it is best simply to use a. uan
uum sweeper to remove best,
uum
them.

## SCS promotes

 Stripecropping By J. David Stipes,Soil Conservation Service Rockeastle County
The Soil Conservation Service in Kentucky is be-
ginning to promote the use of stripcropping on our slofiub cropland. The term
striperopping resp to a syipteropping of alternate crop system of alternate crop
and grass strips running on
the contour in crop fields. The contour in crop fields. The strips vary in width
due to the particular crop grown and machinery agrown and machinery a
daptation. The practice of stripcropping is inexpensive
to install and can be used to install and can be used
with most common types of farm machinery.
Using stripcropping in fields that are strongly
sloping will greatly reduce sloping will greatly reduce
the amount of erosion that will take place. As much as $15-20$ tons per acre of
soil can be saved each yéar sil can be saved each year
when stripcropping is used instead of conventional tillage. There are several farms in. Rockcastle County
that are benefiting from that are benefiting from The Soil Conservation Service personnel. in Mt. Vernon will be glad to assist
