## What About Juvenile Crime?

In addition to advising the fiscal court and prosecuting eases in District Conrt. the County Attorney has the responsibility of writing arrest warrants, search warrants and handling preliminary hearingin felony cases. The County Attorncy office is responsible for handling serious cases despile statements to the contrary by my opponent.
The County Attorney is the ©NLY person with authority to prosecute juveniles in juvenile court. Many juvenile cases involve serious crimes such as stealing, storehouse breaking and receiving stolen property. Juvenile offenders present a very serious problem in Rockeastle County hecause many people feel nothing can be done with them. (My opponent has not even attended the last three session: of juvenile court).
SOMETHING CAN BE DONE. Juvenile offenders who repeatedly commit serions crime should be treated as adults. Only the County Attorney can take this step, a step that has not heen taken, even one time in the past $31 / 2$ years. ## 1984 CONVICTION RATE Here's the Rest of the Story

The County Attorney is not involved in a vast majority of the cases in District Court. The reason for this is many people voluntarily plead guilty and pay a fine (example - almost every traffic ticket, except tickets for drunk or reckless driving, is disposed of by mailing the fine to the District Court). The conviction rate that truly reflects what happened in District Court in 1984 is the number of convictions in cases when people pled not guilty and asked for a jury trial these cases were handled by the county attorney. Here is what the Rockcastle County District Court records show:

True Conviction Rate for 1984 - 2.20/ ${ }^{\circ}$
(The record for 1985 is even worse. Only 1 trial has been attempted and it resulted in a mistrial after an improper question by the County Attorney.)

When cases go unprosecuted, witnesses get tired of coming to court, police officers lose interest and the cases get so old the judge dismisses them. Rockcastle County can have effective law enforcement -- but it requires a lot of hard work by the County Attorney. I WILL DO THAT.
