## BACKBONE FOR FARM EXPORTS NEEDED

1983 the Reagan Administration signed the second Long Term Grain Purchase Agreement with the Soviet Union. After several year of destructive grain embargo this Administration seemed ready to free Americans to sell agricultural products to the Soviet Bloc again. And
the Russians were ready to buy -- or so they said. On paper the Soviet Government committed itself to buying a mifimum of 4 million met ric tons of corn, another 4 million metric tons of wheat and one-hal million metric tons of soybeans. That was the very least they agreed to buy for the following five years.
We're two years into the deal now and guess who is getting the short end of 't? The Russians are more than a million metric tons be-
hind on their minimum wheat purchase. And in the last year they didn't hind on their minimum wheat purchase. And in the last year they didn crop in Kentucky last year was worth $\$ 265$ million.
What is the Administration doing to set the situation right? In the judgement of the Senate, the Administration is the real reason this pur chase agreement isn't working. Our diplomats have moved in and are trying to sell wheat to the Russians $\$ 14$ to $\$ 15$ dollars higher than ou
other regular customers are paying. Given the opportunity to under other regular customers are paying. Given the opportunity to under
sell us, the Australians, the Canadians and the Argentines have moved into the Russian wheat market which by agreement should be ours. And the American farmer is feeling all the adverse effects of another grain embargo without it being called embargo. The Senate has stepped in to help. It has instructed the Administration to sell wheat and othe farm products to long term contracted customers at competitive prices.
Like many in Congress I have written letters to the Secretary of
iculture and to the President's Trade Ambassador and everyone in the Administration that might reasonably be expected to do something about the plight of American agricultural sales

For the first time in memory, American agricultural exports hav gone into deficit. The .U.S. is actually bringing more agricultural products into this country to compete with oursown home grown goods
than we are selling overseas. Five years ago U.S. farmers produced the largest amount of American goods sold abroad. largest amount of American goods sold abroad.
The Administration argues thal -min hem is the high value of the dollar compared to the rest of the world's currencies. They say that
makes U.S. farm products more expensive to foreign buyers. There is makes U.S. farm products more expensive to foreign buyers. There is some basis for that -- but only some. I believe that this administration has lost its appetite-for selling.

Last week I began the first of a series of Senate floor actions aimed results. When the $\$ 300$ million Export Import Bank Authorization was on the floor I asked the Senate to set aside a small percentage of that money and use it instead for Farm Price Support Programs. The Ex port Import Bank's reason for boing is to encourage U.S. Exports and
