A recent civil suit between a local constable, a former state trooper and a former candidate for county judge/
executive was held in Rockcaste exceutive was held in The four day trial, which was spurred by an automobile accident in
February of 1986 ended with a loca jury awarding no money for the jury awarding no money for the
plaintiff, Constable Randall Stevens. The third district constable filed the suit against former Kentucky State Police Trooper Darrell Presley and Leonard "Roge" Hammond, of Mounty Judgc/Executive.

Stevens sucd both men for medical expenses, lost wages, mental and expenses, lost wages, mencal and
physical suffering and permanert
impairment of his power to carn impairme
money.
According to court records the jury found that Pressey was 95 percent at
fault for the accident and that Hammond was 5 percent at fault.
Stevens, who was a passenger in
Presley's cruiser was injured as well Presley's cruiser was injured as

According to a repor filed According to a report filed by KSP
Sgt. David Biggerstoff of London, Hammonds apparently ran a stop signwhile turning left off old Ky. 461 onto U.S. 150. Hammond's truck was struck broadside by Presley's cruiser, which was traveling at a high rate of speed with no emergency lights in
use. use.

At the time of the accident Hammonds was charged with driving under the influence of alcohol, failure to stop at a stop sign, and failure to yield the right-of-way.
He was found guilty in Rockcastle District Court of D.U.I. last Decem-
ber 1. That Circuit Court.
The wreck involving Presley and Hammond was Presley's third accident in a trooper'scar. He is nolonger
with the Kentucky State Police.

## Ordinance 541.0 Amendment for the Public

## Adopted \& Effective 5-2-88

 As set forth in KRS - Chapter 446 SECTION I.Parking on Main Street in The City of Livingston, Kentucky. No exceptions to be made at any time. There will be no and/or the wrong way. No vehicle shall be parked on yellow lines or by fire hydrants.
SECTION II.
Parking on Back and/or Side Streets can be parked as always in the past -- either side of the street and/or facing blocking right-of-way to entrance of street or street itself. This is to allow for all emergency vehicles if and when needed.
