b) Any person who violates IV shall be guilty of a miscemeanor and shall be fined not more than five hundred dollars ( $\$ 500.00$ ), imprisoned for not more than 12 months, or both for each offense. (KRS 525.130)
c) Any person who violates vill ("Dogs Running at Large") shall be fined not less than twenty-five orfars $(\$ 25.00$ ) nor more than one hundred dollars ( $\$ 100.00$ ). Each day of violation constitutes a separate offense.
