"As a race he is detoriorating "As a race he is detoriorating morally every day. Tune has demonstated that he is more 'criminal as a free man than as a slave, that he is intreasing in criminality with frightful rapidity, being one-third more criminal in 1890 than he was in 1880.

ILLITERATES MOST LAW ABIDING

"The startling facts revealed by "The startling facts revealed by the census shows that those who can read-and write are more criminal than the illiterates, which is arme of no other element of our population. I am advised that the minimum illiteracy among the negroes is found in New Rogland, where it is also are researched. where it is 21.7 per cent. The maximum is found in the black belt—Louisiana, Mississippi, and South Carolina—where it is 65.7 percent. And yet the negro in New England is four and one-half times more criminal, hundred for hundred, than be is in the black belt. In the South, Mississippi, particularly, I know he is growing particularly, I know he is growing worse every year. You can scarce by pick up a newspaper whose pages are not blackened with the account of an unmentionable crime committed by a negro brute, and this crime, I want to impress upon the page of the marginal page of the pa you, is but the manifestation of the negroe's aspiration for social equalty, encouraged largely by the char-acter of free education in vogur, which the State is levying tribute upon the white people to maintain. "The better class of negroes are

not responsible for this terrible condition, or for the criminal tendency of their race. Nor do I wish to be understood as censuring them for it. I am not censuring any body; nor am I inspired by ill-will for the negro, but I am simply call-ing attention to a most unfortunate and unendurable condition of affairs. What shall be done about
