and its applications is wholly within the discretioc of the Fiscal Court and its applications is wholly within the discrenoc uf the Fiscal Court
The poll tax in Rockcaste is alveady $\$ 150$ and cannot be made any bigber. The constitution FORBIDS it. The State Road Fund amounts to between $\$ 600.000$ and 8700,00 for the year 1915 and
every yeas thereafter, as long as the law remains on Statute books. every yeay thereafter, as long as the law remains oa statute books. their completion, such other roads as may be agreed upon between the
Fiscal Court and the State Department of Pablic Roads suitable to be Fiscal Court and the State Department of Public Roads suitableto be
improvad will also be granted State aid. Rockcastle County will recelive its pro rata part of the State Road
