sary. precautions to keep sary precautions to keep
the fire from spreading,

someone be with the fire someone be with the fire
until it is completely out. Starting July 15 , 1982, the
minimum fine for violation minimum fine for violation
of the burning laws is of the burning laws is
$\$ 100$. This fine is just for the violation; if a wildfire results from the violation,
the person responsible is the person responsible is
also liable for the cost of also liable for the cost of
controlling the fire and for any damages resulting from
