STATE TAX RATESET Secretary Gary W. Gillis
of the Kentucky Revenue Cabinet today announced that the 1984 state real estate property tax rate has been set
at $22.0^{\prime}$ per $\$ 100$ of valuation. The state real estst rate must be adjusted each year as needed to ensure that no more than a 4 percerit cumulative increase in
zvenues is realized over the previous years.

The 1984 rate of $22.0^{\circ}$ represents a decline of slightly
more than 0.45 percent from the 1983 rate (22.15). Since the beginning of these annual adjustments in 1979, the state rate has experienced yearly declines. Kentucky real estate property owners would have to
pay about $\$ 46$ million more in 1984 state taxes alone if this rollback in the rate had not occurred. This represents a substantial savings.
With the establishment of
the 1984 real estate tax rate in a timely manner, local taxing districts manner. local taxing assured of being able to have tax bills prepared and collected as soon as the local tax rolls have been certified by revenue and local tax rates have been
properly established.
