## Entrapment

Ham, <br> Commonwealth's Attorney <br> Question: What does entrapment mean and is it a valid defense to a criminal charge? <br> Answer: Entrapment is. as the word denotes, the "trapping" of someone into committing a crime. Law enforctement officials cannot "trick" or coerce peaple into crimiral activity and then turn around and prosecute such people for the illegal misconduct. <br> a $a$ More specifically. the Kentucky statute as to entrapment states that ' Coberson is not guilty of anotionsewnen he was induced or encouraged to engage in that conduct by a public servant or by a person acting in cooperation with a publie servant seeking to obtain evidence against him for the purpose of criminal prosecution. <br> There is a very important qualification to this defense however The person seeking the protection cannot be otherwise "predisposed" to engage in such illegal conduct and it is not considered entrapment when the police only affords the defendant an opportunity to commit the crime. <br> We see the defense of entrapment come up most commonly in drug cases where. 'undercover |

Normally, the crimina background of the defendant is not allowed to be introduced. But if a
person is claiming to have been entrapped into selling drugs illeg. ally. he or she is in essence saying that they were not otherwise predisposed to do such things and that the government agent tricked
them into it. Testimony of prior drug sales by the defendant can then be introduced by the state to rebut the entrapment defense. An entrapment defense has a

OHIO SAVINGS CRISIS SHOWS KENTUCKY EDGE The financial crisis of Ohio savings institutions has
caused many Kentuckians to fear for their own deposits. However, a Kentucky law already requires that each sav ings and loan in the state have federal insurance on its deposits.
Deposits of Kentuckians in state-chartered savings in stitutions are safe. They are backed by the federal govern
ment because of a law passed in 1972 when I was governor We enacted that law to prevent a panic such as the recent
one in Ohio.
The Ohio drama is being called the biggest crisis state financial institutions have seen since the Great Depression It was triggered by the failure of Home State Savings Bank which had, much of its assets in a Florida securities firm that
failed. Home State's large holdings werc backed by the Ohio Deposit Guaraniee Fund, but were not federally insured When Home State was closed, it viriually depleted the guarantee fund, casting a cloud over it. The panic resulted when depositors lost confidence in the ability of the fund to guarantee money sitting in other savings institutions it backed throughout the state. The savings institutions were closed until the situation settled, with hopes that they would obtain federal insurance.
Because the institutions were not federally insured, they also were not subject to many federal regulations that might have prevented the Home State collapse from occurring. In addition to pointing out Kentucky's advantages, 1 think this unfortunate situation demonstrates the need for standardized regulationsof financial institutions.
