## Sighting-in is vital for successful hunt

By Roy House
So you've bought yourself a, new deer rifle, equipped it Whth a good quality scope after firing half that box of ammo, you can hit a milk jug at 50 yards. Now you're ready to go deer hunting. Rrong
A $\$ 500$ rifle, topped with a $\$ 150$ scope, firing the best of ammunition won't hit a bull in the behind if it's not sighted-in properily. And the old close-enough-to-a-milkjug to kill a deer theory has cost many a hunter a deer the freezer if they in sighted their rifles in properly.
I have fell victim to the milk jug theory in the past myself. Thinking that if I could shoot close enough to a jug to kick dirt up on it at 50 enough to hit a deer at about any range you can see one

I was wrong. Deer are hard enough fo hit with a rifle that throws a bullet where it's not sighted-in correctly an not sighted-in correctly can It's every hunter's duty to make sure his, or her, gun is shooting the begtpossible. Poorly shooting guns not orily cost hunters deer they lead to more wounded deer which escapes to die later -a
true waste.
If you've gotten a new rifle many seasons for the upcoming November 8 gun season, don't wrait until the astminute - sight-in now. The best way to sigist-in a ifle is from a rock solid rest like a shooting bench, a heavy table or, a car hood. support, will be needed to
