# Joseph Lambert to be sworn-in as Chief Justice of high court

E. Lambert will be sworn-in as the
state's highest ranking member of the
ughterial system when he takes office
as Chief Justice of the Supreme Court
October 5.
Lambert, 50, will replace Robert
F. Stephens as only the fourth Chief
Justice in the state's history.
Lambert, of Mt. Vernon, has
served as a Supreme Court Justice
since he was elected in 1986 to the
seven member court.
He serves the state's hind supreme
court district, which is comprised of
27 counties. He ran unopposed forreelection in 1994. That term expires in
2002.

Replacing Stephens, who served as the court's highest official for 15 years, Lambert is the youngest per-son, at age 50, to ever sit at the top of the state's highest court. He was the nungest person ever elected to the purt in 1986 when at 37 he defeated Laurel County Circuit Judge Charles Luker by 11,000 votes.

# JudgeVenters sentences Gary McKinney to death

On Monday, Rockcastle, Pulaski and Lincoln County Circuit Judge Daniel Venters upheld a jury's rec-ommendation and sentenced a Rockcastle County man to death for the triple murders of his wife and step-children.

After reviewing new sentencing tions that became law earlier this mmer, Venters imposed the death Anter reviewing new sentencing options that became law earlier this summer, Venters imposed the death penalty for Gay Casper McKinney, 31, in connection with the shooting deaths of his wife, 29-year-old Shurghy Bowless McKinney and her children; 11-year-old Brain and 3-year-old Any Michelle Bowles. Their charred bodies were found April 2, 1995, inside a four-room house on Poplar Hollow Road in the Plato Vanhook community of northeastern Pulaski County. The three victims had been shot and died prior to the blaze, according to testimony at the trial.

Prior to pronouncing sentence on the murder charge, Venters said he considered three separate sentencing options before he arrived at his decision. A change in Kentucky statutes apparently gave Venters an option to possibly consider imposing a sentence of life in prison without parole. He said some jurors had asked after the trail why this option was not part of the sentencing phase. McKinney's attorneys, Mike Williams and Mark Statuzziano, asked the court to consider the new sentencing alternatives.

Rockcastle County Schools Special Education Programs are in the need of volunteers to serve as surrogate parents.

A surrogate is required to be appointed by the district when

A. no one can be identified who meets the criteria of

B. a parent is identified but efforts, including registered mail to the last known address, fail to locate the parent; or

C. the child is a ward of the State (i.e., all parental rights have been terminated by a court of competent jurisdiction). A child or youth is a ward of the State when legal responsibility to make decisions regarding the welfare and education of the child or youth has been assigned to a State agency or a representative of a state agency.

The surrogate must be an adult; have knowledge and skills to represent the child; and have no interest that conflicts with the interest of the child. Employees of any agency involved with the care or education of the child are not eligible to serve in this capacity.

Whether it's because of work or play, most of us try to squeeze everything we can into those precious 24 hours we realloted each day—and, in the process, tend to come up a few winks shy a full height of well." Phillips said. The average per-winks the a full height of the company of the comp

"Before the invention of electricity, we were very much dependent on gas light or candlelight for activities after sundown," said Barbara Philips, M.D., professor of pulmonary and critical care medicine at the University of Kentucky, College of Medicine and director of UK's Sleep Disorders Clinic. "But now we're a 24-hour society."

Because of that 24-hour mentality, about a third of us are shift workers, working more than eight hours or hours other than 8 a.m. 5 p.m. Also, with many two-wage-earner families, we sacrifice sleep to spend time with one another. What sthe result? Anoften drowsy American population. "Surveys point towo things that indicate we're sleep elperived: We sleep less on weeknights than we do on weckenights than we do on weckenights than we do no weekended the sleep debt from the week — and alarm clocks are universal. If it takes an

not 'full' of sleep, It's just like pull-ing away from the table before you're full, "Phillips said. The average per-son necds 8.3 hours of sleep in a 24-hour period, but that can vary with the individual. The range that's coa-sidered normal is from five to 10 hours per day. Soyou're not getting enough sleep, but you think you're still functioning pretty well. Maybe not. Studies have shown that depriving geople of sleep hampers their ability to perform skills. Changes in attitude and mood and

Changes in attitude and mooto and difficulty making decisions also are associated with a lack of, or fragmented, sleep. Your body also suffers from a lack of sleep. Sleep loss is linked to a weakened immune system, which means your body isn't as good at fighting off illness as it could be. Sex hormones and growth hormones are secreted when we're asleep, so sleep gives the body a chance to heal wounds and grow tissue. Shift workers have been shown to experience more miscarriage, more peptic ulcer

disease and more hypertension that those who don't work shifts.

So, in the pursuit of a good night's steep, Phillips offered these tips:

A void alcohol and cigarettes. A form of withdrawal occurs after the use of either one, which wakes you pand may cause difficulty in falling back to sleep, "Most smokers who report having insomnia will sleep better if they quit smoking," Phillips asid." Also, many people are uniaware that alcohol actually worsens sleep."

Keep regular sleeping hours. If not, it's difficult for your body clock to stay set.

not, it's difficult for your body clock to stay set.

Exercise-It promotes and consolidates sleep.

Get out in the sunshine. That helps your body know it's daytime.

Consider waring ear plugs. Even if you don't think you're disturbed by noise, your sleep may be.

Forget about substituting caffeine for sleep, too, Phillips advised. When it comes to restoring your body physically and mentally, sweet slumber can't be beat.
