hard to achieve, even with hard to achieve, even with
the advent of shortening day length and cooler temperatures. So pruning in the fall may triggernew growth that
delays dormancya delays dormancy and predis-
poses the plant to winter in poses
It It is better to prune plants in late winter, around midFebruary to mid-March This also allows you to evaluate and remove winterdamaged limbs. Pruning in
late winter will occur just before one of the most active times of plant growth, bud break, when the plant is redirecting stored nutrients from the root system out to
the most rapid time for the plant to heal wounds (in our case the pruned surface),
while fall would be the slowest time for wound healing. An exception is if you are removing dead or severely damaged limbs' due to break-
age, insects or disease. In age, insects or disease. In
that case, it is best for you to remove them as soon as possible at any time of the year. If the plant you are pruning is spring-blooming (gener-
ally flowering before early ally flowering before early
June), it would be better from a flowering display perspective to wait until after flowering to prune since
the pruning process will re the pruning process will re-
